“Assignment Accomplished,” perhaps Weirton’s most famous movie, was first shown to the public during the labor day weekend in 1945. Families of the Weirton Steel Company enjoyed free viewing of the film at the Cove and Anas Theatres as a substitute for the annual Labor Day Pageant, which was cancelled. In the following weeks it was shown at the Grand Theatre in Steubenville and the Mingo Theatre in Mingo Jct., Ohio. This full color movie provides details of the 8-inch artillery shell plant and the World War II production effort by the men and women of Weirton Steel Company. The movie was made with the cooperation of the Ordinance Dept. and Signal Corps of the U. S. Army. The 16 mm movie was produced by Jam Handy Associates of Detroit and narrated by Ted Husing. Weirton people who view this film are left with a proud “Weirton Spirit.” Movie is 24 minutes long.
