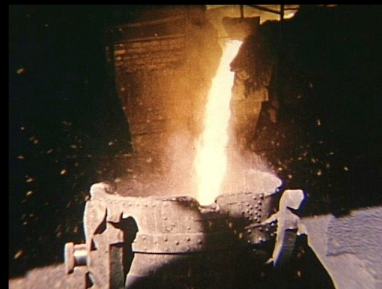
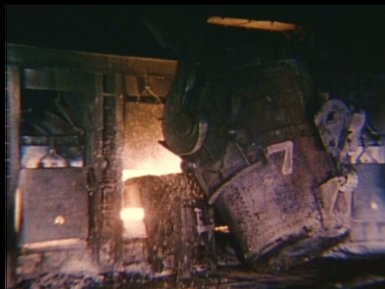

"Tinplate" was first shown during the Weirite Dinner of the National Canners' Convention in Atlantic City on January 18, 1949. This full color movie shows the story of how tinplate is manufactured at Weirton Steel Company and includes scenes of their new 54-inch "mile-a-minute" Hot Mill and the women "tin floppers" in action. Tin can production is also highlighted. Scenes at Weirton Steel Company were filmed under supervision of Ray M. Corll, Industrial Relations Manager. The 16 mm film was produced by the Atlas Film Corp. of Oak Park, Illinois and distributed by the United States Dept. of the Interior Bureau of Mines. R. J. "Skip" Faust was the director. By the year 1954, "Tinplate" was shown over 10,000 times to group audiences and seen by 2 million television viewers.
